THE 3rd EDITION of the CARNAVAL DES COULEURS – 8 to 10 OCTOBER 2021

SHOWS, MUSICAL STARS, ENTERTAINMENT AND CONFERENCES ON THE PROGRAM

Montreal, September 14, 2021 - The BBCM Foundation, which presents the Carnaval des Couleurs at the beginning of October since 2018, reiterates its commitment to offer a quality event for this gathering and celebration of multicultural and LGBTQ + communities for the fight against racism and the fight against homophobia.

This is how, from October 8 to 10, the Complexe Desjardins, Place Émilie-Gamelin and the street in the neighborhood will come alive in various forms, day and night. The simultaneous free performances and shows of the 3rd edition of the Carnaval des Couleurs de Montréal (in dance, music, circus and others), bring together and integrate several cultural, ethnic and LGBTQ + communities in a collaborative, inclusive and cosmopolitan spirit.

Everyone will be able to enjoy these free activities, just before the Fall brings to an end a series of diverse festivals in Montreal over the past few months. Of course, all this will be done under the sign of safety and prevention, in accordance with the health rules imposed by the Direction de la Santé Publique de Montréal.

SAFE EVENTS

Those responsible for the 2021 Carnival of Colors have made a commitment to the authorities to present these activities in a framework and environment that are safe and respectful of the health regulations in effect.

Participants should therefore expect to have to present their vaccination passport or QR code proving their double vaccination. They will also need to provide names and contact details for the registration of participants, as required by Public Health authorities for this type of activities. At Complexe Desjardins and Place Émilie-Gamelin,

everyone will be invited to choose a seat where they will remain as long as they are present. Wearing a mask will also be required while attending certain activities.

"We will do everything humanly and technically possible to make the Carnaval des Couleurs experience as pleasant and as friendly as possible. This is a huge and demanding challenge that we have chosen to take up to make this event possible. We invite people to enjoy it with respect and tolerance", explained the president of the BBCM Foundation, Robert J. Vézina.
